For Young Children:

1. **It's My Body**, by Lori Freeman – A booklet to teach young children how to resist uncomfortable touch. Parenting Press, 7750 31st Avenue NE, Seattle, WA 98115.
2. **I Told My Secret**, by Eliana Gil – A booklet to help children define forms of abuse, who to tell, and what happens after disclosure. Launch Press, PO Box 31491, Walnut Creek, CA 94598.
3. **A Very Touching Book**, by Jan Hindman – Discusses names for the parts of the body and our comfort level in using them and defines bad, good, and secret touching while teaching prevention skills. McClure-Hindman Books, PO Box 208, Durkee, OR 97905.
4. **No More Secrets for Me**, by Oralee Wachter – This book includes four stories about children avoiding situations involving abuse, including babysitter, camp counselor, video parlor patron, and step-parent. 5. **It Happens to Boys, Too**, by Jane Satullo, Roberta Russell, and Pat Bradway – The purpose of this book is to educate boys, their parents, and their teachers about the realities of the sexual abuse of males. Rape Crisis Center of the Bershires Press, 18 Charles Street, Pittsfield, MA 01201.
6. **Something Happened and I'm Scared to Tell**, by Patricia Kehoe – This book, written for the young child ages 3-8 who is a suspected victim of sexual or physical abuse, gives children information and encourages them to speak out about abuse. 7. **Asking About Sex and Growing Up**, by Joanna Cole – Good for parents to read with children. Talks about growing physically and sexually.

For Older Children and Teenagers:

1. **Changing Bodies, Changing Lives**, by Ruth Bell – A book for teens on sex and relationships. Random House, New York, NY.
2. **Dear Elizabeth**, by Gene Mackey and Helen Swan – Written in a diary format, this victim explores her feelings at disclosure and through the healing process. Children's Institute of Kansas City, 9412 High Drive, Leawood, KS 66206.
3. **Getting Together**, by Elizabeth Drake and Anne Gilroy Nelson – This useful booklet is especially for girls who were molested. Child Care Publications, PO Box 12024, Gainesville, FL 32604.
4. **Gilly's Secret**, by Ellen Howard (originally published as **Gillyflower**) - Gilly is too ashamed and frightened to tell her secret. It's not until she befriends a girl next door that Gilly begins to understand that her secret isn't her fault and she must trust someone to help her.
